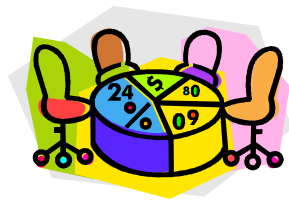

Science & Maths



An application has been submitted for an Award of Science and Maths Excellence. This is part of the Discover Primary Science and Maths (DPSM) programme. Much work went into it and it documents the science and maths journey undertaken by the children during the year including many experiments, talks on geology, dissection of eyes and hearts, signs of spring, planting and growing, materials, and water to name but some of the activities. Thanks are due to Mary and Anna for co-ordinating the initiative and to those parents who offered their time to share their scientific and engineering knowledge.
